

JUST GLASS 2025 EXHIBITION – MORLEY TILES - CALL FOR ENTRY

OPEN TO ALL JUST GLASS MEMBERS AND HONORARY MEMBERS

Timeline

12 JANUARY Let us know if you are making a Morley Tile(s) – up to three

30 JANUARY Photographs are optional but images will be helpful for publicity

24 FEBRUARY Deliver to Morley Gallery between 12 and 4.30 – or make prior arrangements for another exhibitor to deliver.

You are invited to make up to three glass tiles for our MORLEY TILES installation that will form part of the JUST GLASS exhibition. Your tile will be inspired by the local history of Lambeth and Southwark Boroughs in which Morley Gallery and College are located. Celebrating the Adult Education origins of Just Glass we are asking each of you to produce a SQUARE TILE sized 10x10cm with a depth not more than 1.5cm. It must be made with kiln formed glass but it does not have to be 100% glass. It MUST BE SQUARE and displayed on one edge showing a 10x10cm face.

The tiles will be for sale for a maximum of £100 plus p&p. They will be packed up and posted to buyers at the end of the exhibition unless they can be collected on Saturday 8 March.

The Morley Tiles will be shown in a single installation exhibit hence the importance of the accuracy of 10x10cm x max1.5cm

No commission will be taken for these tiles, nor is there a hanging fee for your Tile. You may submit a Tile even if you have no work in the Gallery or the Gallery Shop.

If you can take a photo of your tile send it to us by 30 January we can use it for the publicity (low resolution will suffice)

Deliver your tile on 24 February 2025 between 12 and 4.30pm OR arrange for another artist to deliver it on your behalf (write to justglassociety@gmail.com for help with this if needed).

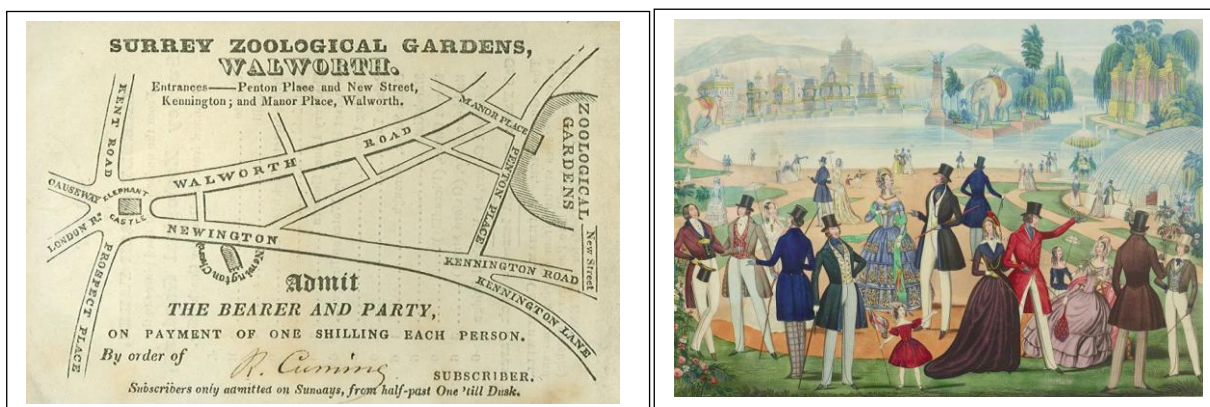
Note that if your tile measurements are inaccurate, we may not be able to include it in the Installation, but, space permitting, it can be put in the Gallery Shop (with a 10% commission).

Background Information & Inspiration

19th Century Lambeth and Southwark were full of industry: household ceramics and sanitary ware, Kennington Bottle Works and makers of plate glass, and emery glass in Glasshouse Road and Blackfriars Road. Nearby are: China Works – the original HQ of Royal Doulton in Black Prince Road. St. George's Cathedral, with its wonderful stained glass; the Imperial War Museum - built as an asylum, an original Bedlam Hospital. Other places to inspire are the Cinema Museum, The Garden Museum, Damien Hirst's Gallery; Newport Street Gallery; Lambeth Palace; Lambeth Palace Library; The Old Operating Theatre; Florence Nightingale Museum. The Old Vic Theatre founded by Lillian Baylis; Lambeth Walk; Leake Street Arches; Vauxhall City Farm; The Oval cricket ground; M16 Building; Lambeth & Southwark Bridges, South Lambeth Tube Station and the Morley College and Gallery buildings themselves.
